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Vision Plan for 2007-2008

Healthy eyes are an important part of your overall health. Routine eye examinations not only keep your eyewear current; they can also detect high-risk health issues such as diabetes and glaucoma before symptoms occur. Whether you have 20/20 vision or 20/200 vision, you should have a routine eye examination on a regular basis to keep your eyes healthy.

Routine Vision Benefit Schedule

(Benefits for eye refraction not covered)

BlueChoice HMO members receive a separate ID card to be used only for their routine vision benefits

Exam and frames -

Routine Yearly Care – Vision benefits the same for PPO, MPOS (In and Out-of-Networks) as well as CareFirst BlueChoice HMO. Plan pays up to \$45 per benefit period towards the **exam**, and \$45 per benefit period towards the **frames**. **Available once every benefit period**. Visit any vision provider of your choice! **Benefits are not included for eye refractions.**
